Carroll3

The Carroll3 Program offers a 25 percent savings on the net cost of an undergraduate degree at Carroll University. This means less money borrowed from student loans and an added year of earning potential that's gained by completing college early.

There is no additional cost to Carroll3 Program students for taking extra credits during the fall and spring semesters. The eight required credits to be completed outside of the fall and spring semesters will be charged independently, however, those credits can easily be covered by AP credits, college credit, etc. so most students won't incur any additional cost.

Special Policy for International Students

International students who are required by Carroll to demonstrate English proficiency can receive 16 elective credits for exceeding the University benchmark on an approved English proficiency exam and completing ENG170 with a grade of B or higher. For more information on proficiency exam policies, contact your international admission counselor at international@carrollu.edu.

The policy awarding 16 elective credits to international students who excel in an English proficiency exam and complete ENG170 with a grade of B or higher is crucial for those in the Carroll3 program. It allows International students to meet their credit requirements without needing summer classes, thus maintaining the program's three-year completion goal and reducing overall educational costs and time spent in school.

International students can often reduce their total cost by transferring credits or earning credit through options like IB, A-levels, retroactive English credit, and more. Explore how your previous studies might count toward your Carroll degree.

COMPETITIVE SCHOLARSHIPS

Applications for the following scholarships can be found at carrollu.edu/financial-aid/international-students/scholarships.

MacAllister and Yersin Full-Tuition Scholarships

Full tuition each year for four years. Requires special application and on-campus interview. The recipient is not eligible for any other Carroll scholarships or grants.

Davies Otto Fellow Science Scholarship

\$10,000 total; \$2,500 renewable per year. For students majoring in the sciences. Requires special application and interview.

Engineering Scholarship Program

\$4,000-\$20,000 total; \$1,000-\$5,000 renewable per year. Available to students majoring in pre-engineering/applied physics. Requires special application.

Esports Scholarships

Varying renewable amounts. Up to \$2,500.

This award is presented to incoming students who have shown excellent performance ability in a selected Esport title. Requires special application and try out.

Available to all incoming students, regardless of major.

William A Ganfield Fellowship

\$5,000 total; \$1,250 renewable per year. Available to students majoring in history, global studies, political science, or religious studies. Requires special application and interview.

George and Gerald Bitters Endowed Scholarship

\$1,000-\$3,000 per year. Available to students from South Milwaukee or Cudahy High School with 2.0 or higher GPA. Requires special application.

Theatre Scholarships

\$4,000 total; \$1,000 renewable per year. Available to students majoring or minoring in theatre or musical theatre. Based upon audition.

Music Scholarship

Varying renewable amounts. Based upon audition. Music majors and non-majors are eligible.

Anne Hardy Art Scholarship

\$1,750 three-year total. Available to students majoring in art or photography. Requires special application and submission of an art portfolio.

Les Klug Photography Scholarship

\$500 one-year scholarship. Available to students majoring in photography. Requires special application and submission of photography portfolio.

Opportunity Scholarship

\$2,000-\$10,000 per year. Selection is based on candidate's potential to contribute to the diversity of Carroll's community. Requires a special application.

Yersin Business Scholarship

Varying renewable amounts. Available to students majoring in accounting, business administration, business economics, finance, healthcare administration, management and leadership or marketing.

B.S. Chemistry, Pre-Health Emphasis

Now: Ph.D. Researcher in Chemical Ecology at iDiv and Friedrich Schiller University Jena

Linh Mai Nhat Nguyen came to Carroll University with a curiosity for science and left with the research experience, mentorship and confidence to pursue a career in biodiversity research. While completing her B.S. in Chemistry with a Pre-Health Emphasis, Linh received both the Pioneer Scholar Grant and the Tri-Beta Research Grant. These awards allowed her to conduct independent research, shaping her future path in chemical ecology.

She presented her work at major scientific conferences, including the International Society of Chemical Ecology and Southeast Partners in Amphibian and Reptile Conservation. She earned awards for both Best Talk and Best Poster, and credits these experiences with strengthening her skills in scientific communication and deepening her commitment to academic research.

Victoria Asuar Aznárez had multiple opportunities to work one-on-one with English faculty during her time at Carroll. In her second year of college, Victoria was awarded the PioScholar research scholarship, which allowed her to conduct independent research on diversity in college and its cinematographic representation. Under the mentorship of Dr. Galow, she explored this topic and began writing her own TV script, combining academic research with creative writing.
